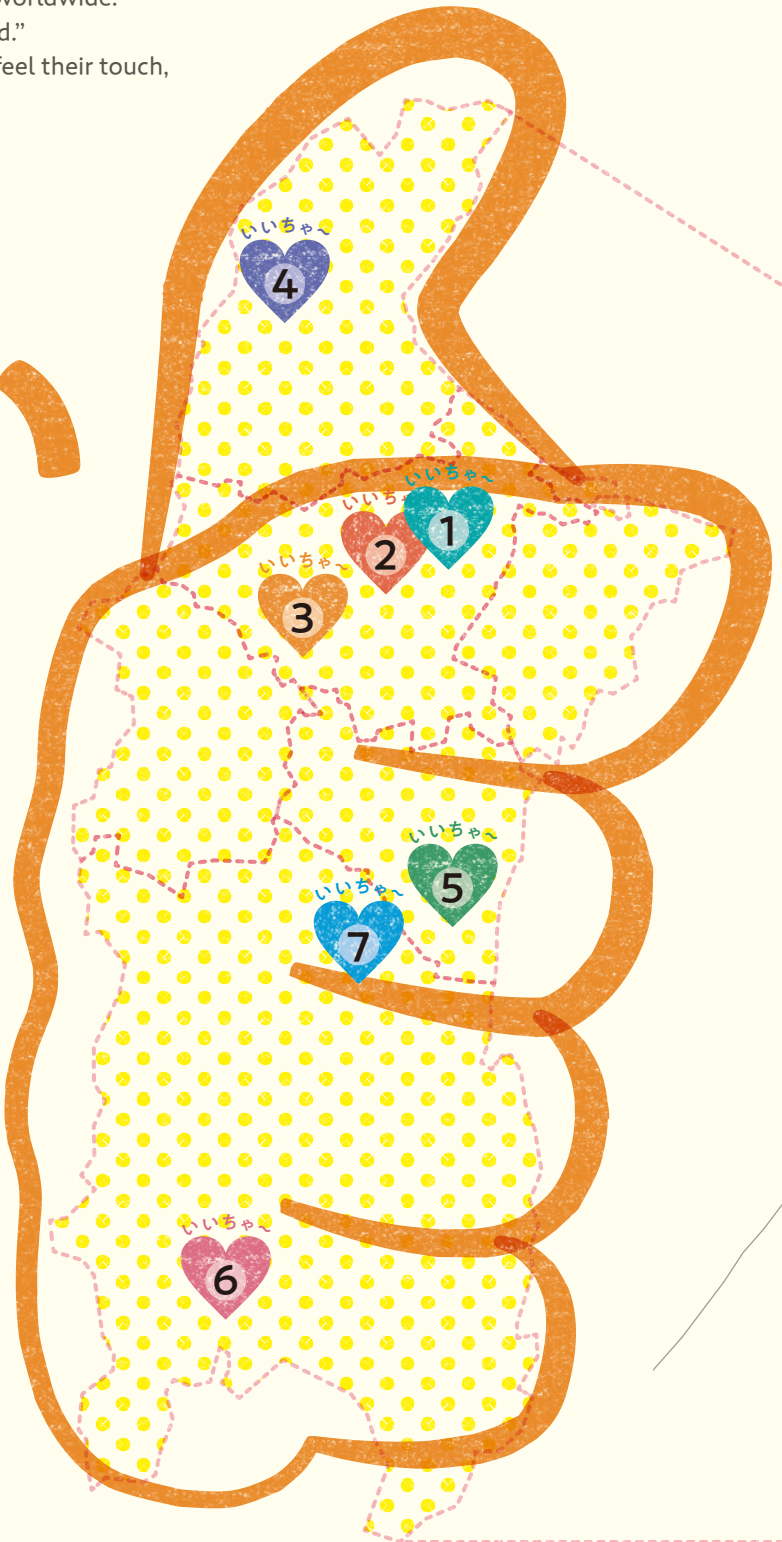

400 Years of Heritage: Takaoka's Metal Casting Techniques

The metal casting industry of Takaoka, which began in 1611, was first centered on ironware such as pots, cauldrons and hoes. However, sophisticated metal processing techniques developed in the creation of Buddhist altar fittings and artistic crafts using copper alloys. In recent years, a variety of interior décor items with excellent design are sold across Europe and North America. The bronze statues of Doraemon and Sazae-san were also made in Takaoka.

Temple commemorating Maeda Toshinaga (second lord of the Maeda family), the founder of Takaoka who invited 7 skilled metal casters to his castle-town.

③ Great Buddha of Takaoka

Once qualified by the waka poet Akiko Yosano as being "significantly more handsome than the one in Kamakura," Takaoka's Great Buddha, the crystallization of Takaoka's bronze casting techniques, is one of the three Great Buddhas of Japan.

400 Years of Long-Lasting Affection

Takaoka Lacquerware originated 400 years ago, when artisans began to paint drawers and trays using Japanese lacquer (*urushi*). Three decoration techniques characteristic of Takaoka (*chokoku-nuri*, *yusuke-nuri*, and *aogai-nuri*) were established by the beginning of the Meiji era, epitomized by Takaoka's Mikurumayama floats. In recent years, lacquerware are incorporated into everyday use items such as glasses and various accessories through designer collaborations.

Takaoka Mikurumayama Festival

Takaoka's Mikurumayama Festival, designated as a UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage, is said to have originated in the carriage that Maeda Toshinaga conferred to the townspeople of Takaoka at the time of his castle's construction. Historical records and photos explain how Takaoka developed as a town as well as the origins of dozō-zukuri warehouses.

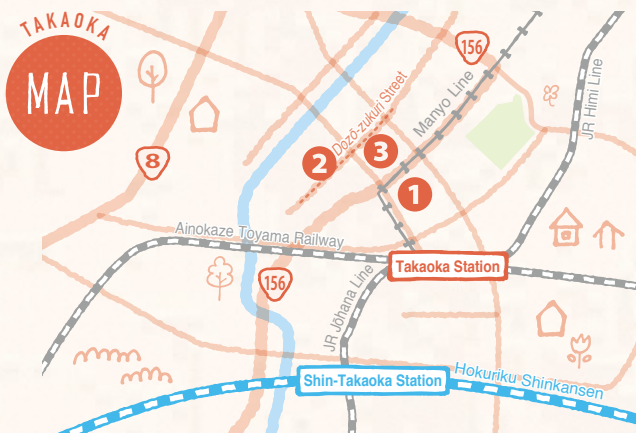

90% of Japan's Sedge Hats Made in Etchū-Fukuoka

The flourishing of sedge (*suge*) from Oyabe River's flooding marked the beginning of the sedge basket/hat industry. In its heyday, about 2.1 million hats from Etchū-Fukuoka are sold annually, and to this day Fukuoka-machi is claiming 90% of Japan's production in sedge hats.

The Old Hokuriku Region Main Road

The old Hokuriku region main road is lined with many *sugegasa* warehouses. Even now, traces of its prosperity still remain. The lord of the Kaga family used to travel on this road for the purpose of Sankin-kōtai (a policy requiring feudal lords to alternate living between the capital and their domain yearly).

100 Years of Continued Polishing

Using the high-quality logs brought by the flow of Shōgawa River, the production of woodturning crafts began in the late Edo period. Later, as it became people's dream to own a complete set of wooden bowls for the occasion of the Hōonkō (traditional Japanese Shin Buddhism observance), the woodturning technique of the region continued to evolve. The passion that lasted for a hundred years bloomed into excellent interior décor today.

1000 Years: Everlasting Japanese Washi Paper

The traditional Japanese paper made in Toyama Prefecture's Gokayama, Yatsuo, Birudan regions is collectively referred to as Etchū-washi. Among the latter, washi entirely made from kozō (*paper mulberry*) in Gokayama is particularly durable and was used as Kaga Family's exclusive writing paper. Besides its stature in the reparation of old documents, washi is used by designers to create neat accessories, receiving acclaim at international trade fairs.

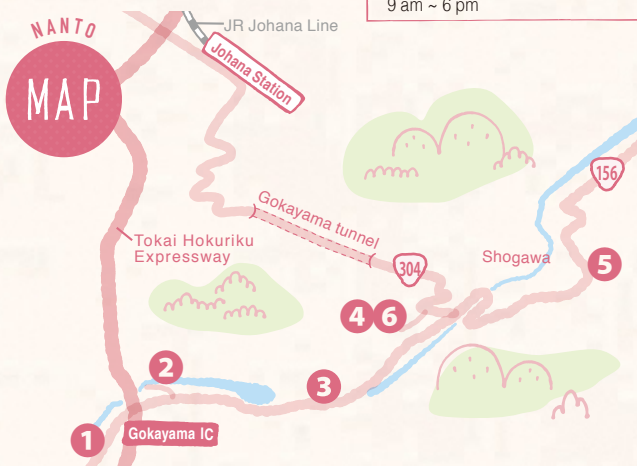

Masters of 200 Chisels and Carving Knives

Inami's woodcarving originated at Zuisenji Temple (Inami branch) constructed in the 14th century. After its main hall burned down in mid-18th century, the technique of imperial woodcarvers, called in from Kyoto for its reconstruction, was passed down and flourished as Inami Woodcarving. From ranma (decorative transom pieces), tsutate (movable screens), to small interior items, Inami's woodcarvers excel as masters of more than 200 chisels and carving knives.

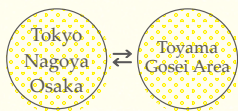

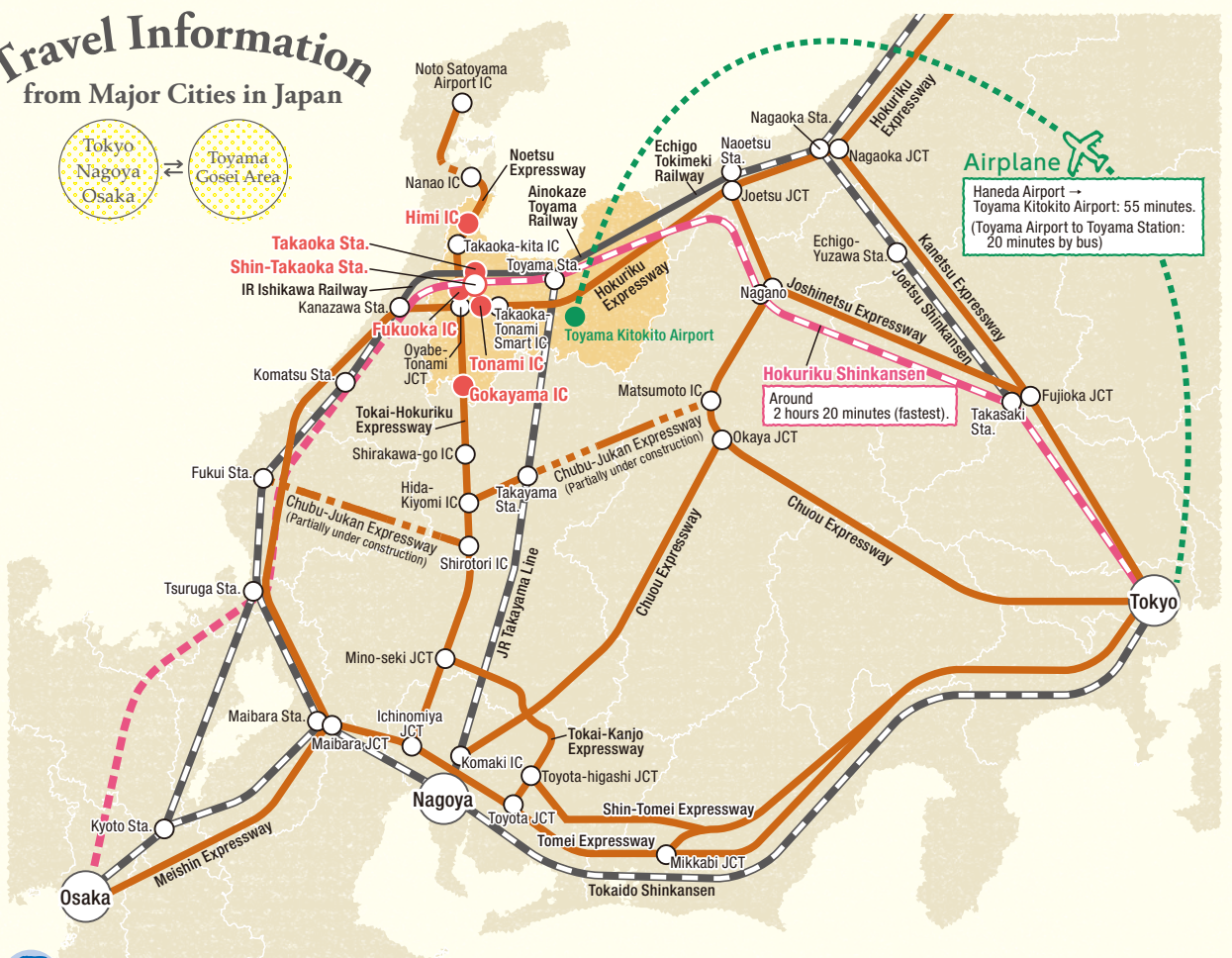
